



PLATTED RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISION ENTRYWAY BEAUTIFICATION GRANT PROGRAM GUIDELINES

A. GRANT PROGRAM

The Bayfront Community Redevelopment District Beautification Grant Program is designed to assist and help offset the cost of installing new entryway signage and landscaping for platted residential subdivisions. The financial portion of the grant will fund up to 50 percent of the actual costs of the eligible improvements (all landscape materials are eligible) with an amount not to exceed \$2,000 per program (signage and landscaping) and \$3,000 total maximum per entryway. The funds will be provided on a reimbursement basis once all work is complete. Complete backup documentation is required for reimbursement. Once work has been completed, the applicant(s) shall submit copies of all paid invoices along with cancelled checks to the Bayfront Community Redevelopment Department (the Department). The City will conduct an inspection of the work and if approved, the Department will recommend reimbursement within two (2) weeks.

B. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

A primary objective of the Bayfront Platted Residential Beautification Grant Program is to encourage residential neighborhoods in the District to make the entrances to their neighborhoods attractive and inviting, thus promoting the vision of the Bayfront Community Redevelopment District.

The Bayfront Platted Residential Neighborhood Beautification Grant Program is designed to offer reasonable and proportionate financial assistance to residential neighborhoods to periodically invest or reinvest in the entryways to their neighborhoods.

C. ADMINISTRATION

The Bayfront Redevelopment District Residential Subdivision Beautification Grant Program will be administered by the Department. Applications will be received on an ongoing basis as long as the program is in force and funding is available. Each neighborhood will be considered independently on a first-come basis.

A **pre-application meeting** between the prospective applicant and the Department is mandatory as a means of answering questions, clarifying issues, and in general expediting the application process.

The program will be funded from the Bayfront Community Redevelopment District tax increment fund through the Bayfront Redevelopment Agency's budget allocation.

D. CONSISTENCY WITH LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL REGULATIONS

The eligible neighborhoods must demonstrate consistency with the City of Palm Bay's Comprehensive Plan and Land Use and Development Regulations. Grant recipients shall be in compliance with all City codes.

E. PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Application for grants must be made by officers of the neighborhood's active home owners association/property owners association. To be eligible for this program, the neighborhood and entryway to be improved must be located in the Bayfront Redevelopment District (see Attachment "A"). The neighborhood's representative(s) must also provide the City staff with a complete application including all supporting documentation substantiating both the general and specific criteria. The neighborhoods must supply the necessary matching funds in the project to be considered for funding.

To become eligible to receive a platted residential beautification grant, it is required that the property be clean and attractive with no visual signs of neglect or blight. Property taxes shall be current. Proposed signs and landscaping shall be located on private property and not in city, county or state rights of way.

F. GENERAL CRITERIA

It should be generally understood that the Bayfront Platted Residential Beautification Grant program is designed to promote the general aesthetic improvement of the Bayfront Community Redevelopment District's residential neighborhood entryways. The beautification element is only one essential part of the Bayfront "Restore and Landscaping" programs.

Improvements must begin within thirty (30) days following approval by the Department as well as the other City departments that are responsible for reviewing the project. Work is to be completed within thirty (30) days from the date of the Notice to Proceed issued by the owner, unless otherwise authorized.

G. SPECIFIC CRITERIA

LANDSCAPE GRANT:

Landscape Plan

The applicant will submit a landscape site plan indicating pertinent dimensions, plant locations, plant sizes, plant species, relationship to property lines and structures including entry way sign, materials to be used, existing vegetation locations, irrigation supply sources and location, etc.

Irrigation/Water Supply

All landscaped areas shall be provided with an irrigation system or available water supply with at least one (1) outlet located within one hundred fifty (150) feet of the plant material.

Plant Selection

The quality of all plant materials will be Florida Grade No. 1 or better as specified by Florida Department of Agriculture. Plantings shall be designated by common and or scientific name and located in conformance with specific requirements of the city ordinance, Section 185.142 (see Attachment “B”). See the Attachment “C” for “plant suggestions.” The suggested list includes trees, shrubs and ground cover.

Maintenance

Constant care is required in the first year to ensure that the root system extends into the soil and to ensure that plants fill out in a healthy manner by minimizing excessive top growth. Annual maintenance is equally important. The grant recipient will sign an agreement (Attachment “D”) with the Department to maintain the approved landscape project. The required maintenance program should include an annual fertilizing schedule (two or three times a year), an annual mulch replacement schedule, and an annual plant replacement element. Failure to maintain the property to the standards of the agreement will result in a City code violation and the property owner(s) may be subject to the repayment of all landscaping grant funds that have been extended for the project.

SIGNAGE GRANT:

Signage improvements shall include monument entryway signs. The City’s sign code shall be adhered to. The location of proposed signs shall be depicted on a survey of the property. The color, construction and material of any sign should be compatible with the Bayfront Community Redevelopment District’s Design Guidelines. Specification drawings shall be submitted that show the design, color, construction, and material of each sign. Any sign work must obtain permits from the City of Palm Bay Building Department.

H. AGREEMENT TO MAINTAIN

The applicant agrees and covenants that in the event the applicant receives and accepts any grant money, the applicant shall maintain the project in which the proceeds are to be used in good and attractive condition (see Attachment “D”). Any landscaping installed with grant monies or in connection with the project for which grant monies are being extended shall be maintained and irrigated as necessary. Additionally, any dead or missing vegetation must be promptly replaced. If the applicant fails to do so after thirty (30) days written notice from the Department, the Department shall have the right, in addition to all other remedies available to it, including any remedies of the City of Palm Bay Code Enforcement Board, to bring an action in the court of appropriate jurisdiction to recover all grant funds extended, regardless of the extent of the failure to maintain and the City/Bayfront Community Redevelopment Agency shall have the right to collect any attorney fees and/or costs incurred from bringing such action.

**ATTACHMENT “D”
MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT**

I UNDERSTAND THAT IN ORDER FOR MY REQUEST FOR BEAUTIFICATION GRANT FUNDING TO BE APPROVED, THAT I AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING:

1. Any landscaping installed with grant monies or in connection with the project for which grant monies are being extended shall be maintained and irrigated as necessary.
2. Any dead or missing vegetation must be promptly replaced.
3. Failure to replace dead or missing vegetation within thirty (30) days notice by the Bayfront Community Redevelopment Department may result in the City/Bayfront Redevelopment District using legal remedies to recover all grant funds extended, regardless of the extent of the failure to maintain, including the right to collect attorney fees and court costs.
4. Sign and parking lot improvements constructed with grant funds shall be maintained to the fullest extent possible. Failure to maintain sign and parking lot improvements may result in Code Enforcement action.
