Budget Hearing

The City Council is required by Florida Statute to hold a public hearing on the tentative millage rate and the proposed FY 14 budget.

Staff will begin the meeting by reading a statement regarding the tax rate and providing a brief summary of the proposed budget.

Following the initial staff commentary, the public hearing should commence.

At the close of the public hearing, the Council will consider:

- Any changes in the tentative tax rate and the percent of increase over rollback (if any);
- Adoption of the tentative millage rate:
- First reading of Utility Rate Ordinances amending Chapters 200, 201 and 202 to codify the rate adjustments previously approved; and,
- First reading of the Budget Adoption Ordinance.

The final item on the agenda is a discussion of the proposed rates, fees and charges. Staff is preparing a summary analysis of the process as well as the few requested changes. The Council's direction regarding these changes will be incorporated into the ordinances/resolutions that will officially enact the fees.

RE: FY 2014 Budget Changes

The attached summary of budget changes identifies all changes made to the preliminary budget that was provided to you in early July. There are a few minor corrections as well as budget adjustments based on concepts discussed in workshops. The following is a brief summary of the primary changes:

- After consultation with the City's auditors, we have budgeted the pension contribution credit differently. The amount changed to correct an error in the original amount.
- The transfer of the net revenue in the Red Light Camera Fund to the General Fund has been eliminated. These funds will be held in reserve pending Council direction at a later date.
- The bunker gear financing and purchase were removed from the proposed budget since this
 was accomplished in FY 2013.
- The City Manager's Office budget was increased by \$10,000 to cover county-wide Chamber of Commerce memberships.
- The Growth Management Department's budget was increased by \$20,000 for the O.N.E. Community neighborhood grant program.
- The facilities contract management function is being moved from the Finance Department to the Parks and Recreation Department.
- A position in Finance was budgeted in the incorrect division and is being moved to the correct division.
- A part-time position in Public Works was budgeted in the incorrect division and is being moved to the correct division.

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- The 2008 Pension Obligation Bond refinancing was removed from the budget (Fund 221 reduced to 0) and funds were re-budgeted under the variable rate/SWAP fund (Fund 218) to reflect the delay in refinancing.
- The BCRA revenue was revised downward.
- The Utilities Operating budget was revised as follows:
 - decrease estimated interest income:
 - increase the transfer to the Utilities Renewal and Replacement Fund (Fund 424) to meet debt service coverage and minimum fund balance requirements;
 - increase to reflect reclassification of Customer Service Representative to Customer Service Coordinator; and,
 - reduce travel and training.
- The Risk Management Fund budget was adjusted to include the consultant's analysis of Parks and Recreation facilities relative to the Americans with Disabilities Act.

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-47

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TITLE XX, UTILITIES CODE, CHAPTER 200, UTILITIES CODE, BY ADJUSTING THE RATES, FEES, AND CHARGES FOR THE CITY'S UTILITIES SYSTEM AND SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CITY OF PALM BAY CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY,

SECTION 1. The City of Palm Bay Code of Ordinances, Title XX, Utilities Code,

Chapter 200, Utilities Code, is hereby amended and shall henceforth read as follows:

"Section 200.03 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS REGARDING UTILITIES SERVICES.

* * *

(M) Change of Occupancy. When a change of occupancy occurs on premises with Utilities services, notice shall be provided to the City not less than three (3) days prior to the date of change by the outgoing customer. The outgoing customer shall be held responsible for all Utilities services rendered on such premises until notice is received by the City and the City has had reasonable time to discontinue the Utilities services. However, if such notice has not been received, the application of a succeeding occupant for Utilities services will automatically terminate the prior account. A customer may pay a same day service fee to reconnect or disconnect services on the same day. The customer's deposit may be transferred from one service location to another service location with City Utilities. The customer's deposit may be transferred from one name to another as long as the customer makes a request. Rate for same day service fee shall be set as follows:

Section 200.04 METER INSTALLATION RATES.

(A) Each applicant shall be charged for the meter, backflow prevention device, meter service box and for installation of the meter. Rates for meter installations for all meter sizes will be set as follows:

Section 200.05 METER TESTING.

- (A) Meter testing shall be done at the customer's request, and in accordance with the following guidelines and schedules:
- (1) Meter Test Request. If any customer requests a test of the meter, the City will require a meter test or bench test fee which fee shall be set as follows:

Section 200.07 DISCONNECTING, RECONNECTING, AND TRANSFERRING SERVICE.

- (A) There shall be a charge for City service connections and for transferring of City accounts from the name of one person to the name of another, which shall be paid before the service connection is made or accounts changed. There shall be no service connection charge if the original service connection for meter installation or service installation fee has been paid.
- (1) Transferring Service. The charge for the transfer of service to a new customer account at a previously served location or reconnection of service subsequent to a customer requested disconnection shall be set as follows. If after the reconnection the customer does not have water service due to the main valve at the house being in the off position, and the field service representative returns to the property, an additional service initiation fee will be applied to the account for each return trip to be set as follows:

(2) Reconnection. When service is discontinued because of nonpayment of amounts due or non-sufficient funds, the disconnection/reconnection fee will be applied to the account as set forth below. If service is ordered discontinued because of nonpayment of the amount due, then payment is subsequently received (thus preventing the service from being discontinued), an administrative fee will be applied to the account. If service has been discontinued because of non-payment and water service is restored without authorization by the City, the City shall remove the meter and a pulled meter charge will be applied to the account. Service shall not be restored until the customer has paid the entire amount of the delinquent bill, together with penalties and the pulled meter charge. A re-install meter charge shall be applied to any account requesting to have a meter re-installed.
